Message from the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

The final term of the year has had a smooth start and students have settled in well.

We are beginning to look ahead in preparation for the 2023 school year. If you are leaving the College at the end of the year it would be appreciated if you could please notify staff at College Reception as soon as possible (phone call or in writing). As in previous years, we have had a number of enrolment enquiries for 2023 at all year levels and we are aiming to finalise our class organisation by the end of November.

This year, I would like to provide parents/guardians with an opportunity to have an input into the educational requirements for their child/children. If you have any educational considerations for the placement of your child/ children for 2023 please let me know in writing (envelopes marked Confidential, specifically addressed to The Principal) by Friday October 28th, at the latest. Please do not request individual teachers as staffing will not be finalised at this time. These letters can be left at the front office or posted to the school. Please note no requests will be taken after this date.

The College has many exciting events taking place this term including the Creative Minds night scheduled to take place on Tuesday 18th October during which a range of amazing student work will be showcased. The event will take place in the secondary Food Technology space and will run from 6-8pm.

As you may be aware, new COVID settings have been announced, based on advice from the Department of Health, and became applicable from 11.59pm Wednesday 12 October 2022.

It is strongly recommended that students:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- should not attend school after 5 days if still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school
- advise the school of the COVID-19 positive test result
- Where students become symptomatic at school they should:
- be collected by their parents/carers
 - undergo testing for COVID-19

Parents and carers will therefore be asked to continue to report positive student COVID-19 cases using the VicED COVID Tool. Where a parent/carer informs the school by phone or written notification, the school should complete the Schools COVID Case Management Tool.

In addition, the current mandatory vaccination requirement for visitors and volunteers has ceased and those who wish to wear a mask will be supported to do so.

Lastly, a friendly reminder that there is a Curriculum Day (pupil free) on Friday 21st October. Staff will be undertaking their second Berry Street Educational Model professional learning session and are looking forward to implementing strategies that will support the wellbeing of students in their classes.


Timbarra Fundraising Group Second Hand Uniform Stall

The Public Relations Officers conducted pre and post game interviews with the players, created individual player profiles and wrote mock news articles on the events of the tournament



INDONESIAN INDEPENDENCE DAY

Last term, students throughout the college celebrated Indonesian Independence Day. After learning about how and why it is celebrated, we played some games to signify the struggle Indonesians had to endure to fight for their freedom. Additionally, Students were able to reflect also how they have had to persist in their own challenges in life.

Future journalist, Cooper Emanuelli from 5M wrote this report about Indonesian Independence Day:



Indonesia became independent in 1945 on the 17th of August. You know Indonesia is independent because unlike Australia they have a president. Australia doesn't have a president because we are not independent, we have a prime minister.

To claim independence, Indonesia had to fight the Netherlands. Japan occupied the islands from 1942 to 1945. So Indonesia declared independence after Japan's fall and it took Indonesia four hard years to get independence. That's why we celebrate it because it took four hard years of being invaded, bombed, sitting in trenches and gun fire and hard labour. 100,000 military federations and 45,000 civilians died. In total, 3-4 million soldiers died. So we celebrate Independence day and we only celebrate it for one day (while it took 4-5 years to get independence).

So that is why we celebrate it and remember those who died fighting.
