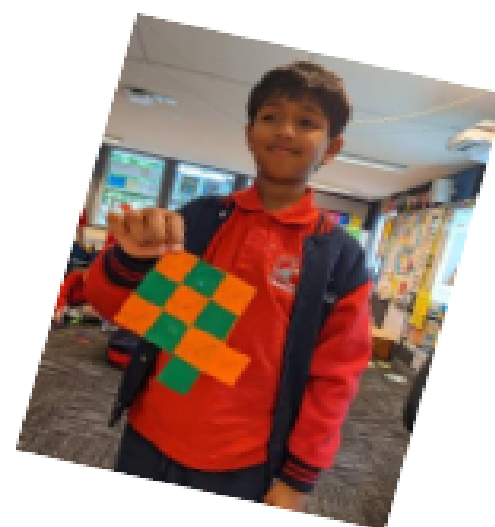

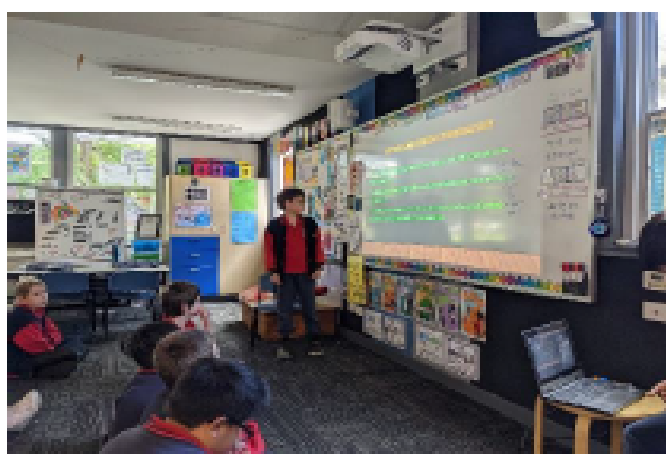
We received our certificates for completing the Premier's Reading Challenge!

Yabbi was really funny when he spoke to King Neptune. Sterky, the seahorse, was funny as well, when he was telling the truth.

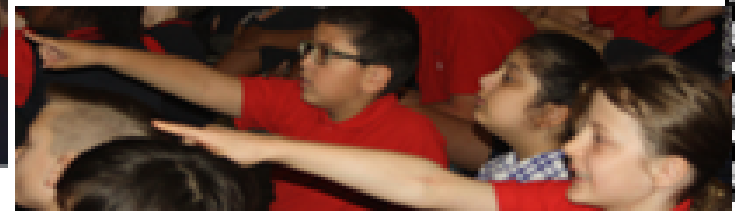
Azra and Mackenzie

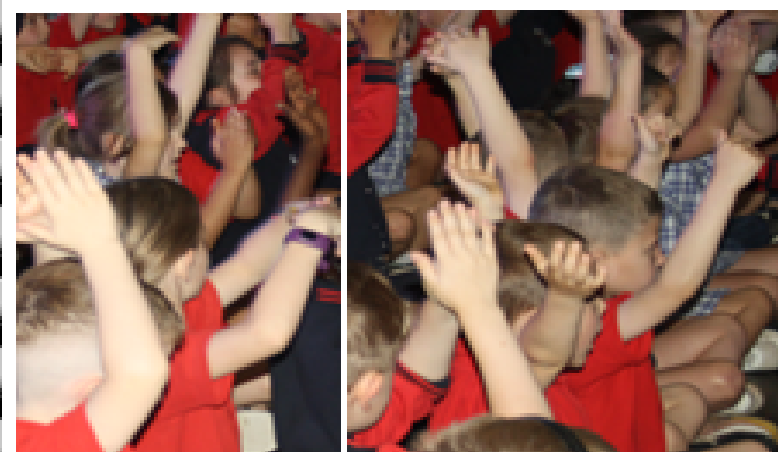
We liked having the chance to ask the cast members questions. I asked about Alpha Show's version of 'The Little Mermaid'.
Madison I was going to ask about who their favourite character was to play in the show of 'The Little Mermaid'. **Darcie**



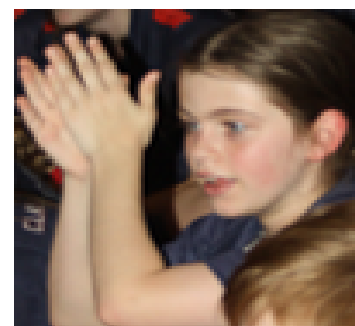

My mum came to our buddy performance. She was so funny trying to learn how to play Gadigi Nyian. James

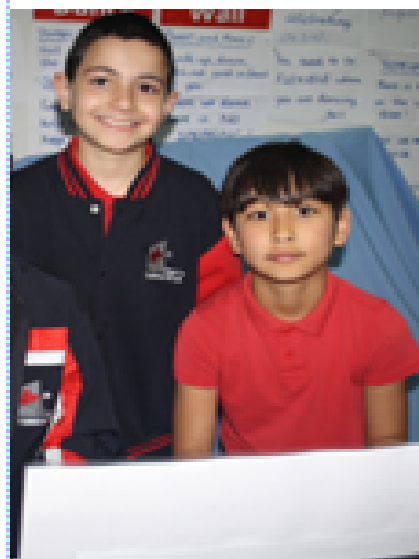
It was really nice to have dad, Blake and Neve come to our buddy class performance. Dad hit the marimba hard with the beaters. Asha

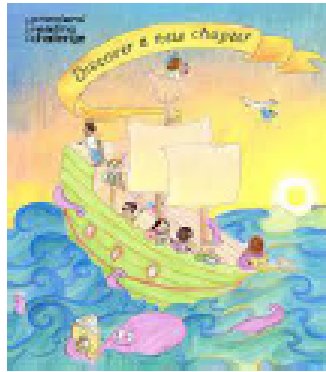

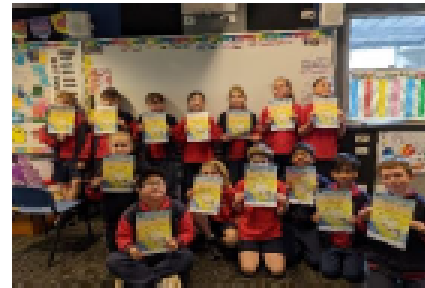
Congratulations to the 197 students who completed the Premier's Reading Challenge this year. We had a total of 8727 books read. What an amazing effort!

What do you love most about writing?

How do you get your ideas for writing?

What message or advice would you give to other young authors?
